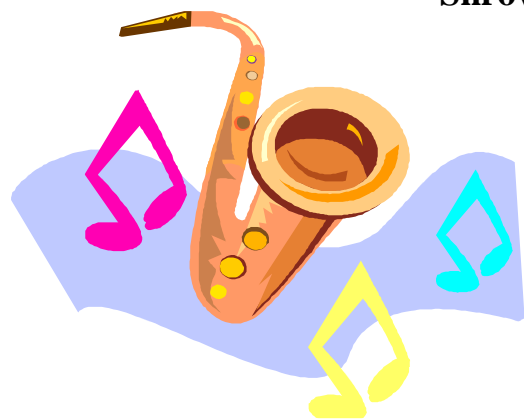


**STEP AT A TIME ROAD RACE**

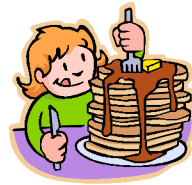

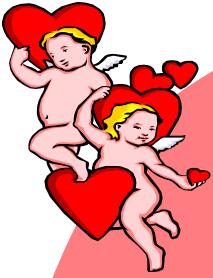

**WHAT IS ST. MARGARET'S

## **Rite 13 Ceremony held at the 9 am Eucharist on January 28th.**

Last week the congregation gathered at the 9 am Eucharist had the privilege and joy of celebrating with two young members of St. Margaret's and their parents at a Rite 13 ceremony held in their honor. The purpose of the Rite 13 ceremony is to acknowledge the transition young people begin when they reach their teenage years, and lift it up as part of God's plan for each of us to mature and reach the full stature of Christ as we strive to become adults. It also acknowledges the reality of the phase of parenthood their mothers and fathers are entering; often difficult years of tension of dependence and independence as their children grow up. The Rite 13 Ceremony is a key component of the Journey to Adulthood program used in Sunday school with the 6th—12th graders at St. Margaret's

The service begins with a renewal of Baptismal vows by the congregation. Then they are presented to the priest by the adult leaders of their Sunday school class. The ceremony continues with the participants or "celebrities" reading psalm 139. Next their parents are acknowledge and blessed. Then their peers and the congregation pledge to stand by them. Finally, the celebrities are blessed and sent forth. A reception in their honor follows the service in the parish hall. At St. Margaret's each celebrity is presented with a teen study Bible, a certificate marking the occasion. Parishioners are also encouraged to write words of advice and congratulations for the celebrities in "Words of Wisdom from St. Margaret's Church" books made available during the reception. 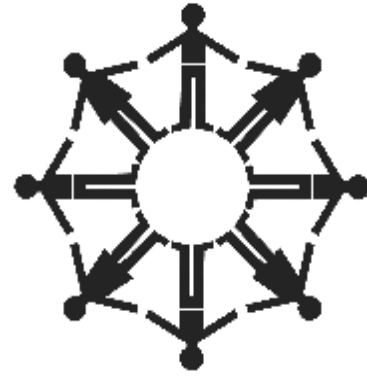
