As we stand on the threshold of 2007, I continue to be grateful for the people of St Margaret's. I am grateful for your continued love for and support of our parish's ministries and mission. Because you have been generous with your presence, your unique talents, your passion, your time, your energy and your money, St. Margaret's continues to be a powerful sign of Christ's love in our community.

St. Margaret's is known as "the little white church that gives." And we do give. Thirty-two percent of our 2007 Budget is earmarked in support of outreach endeavors. My experience tells me that most parishes struggle to give away 10-15% in Outreach dollars.

Not surprisingly, a major portion of 2007 Budgeted 32% is allocated for the continued direct aid ministry of St. Margaret's Community Outreach. Due to the faith and passion of our Director of Outreach, Catherine Gordon, income from grants and foundations is rising. Catherine has done an outstanding job this year building collaborative relationships with churches, charities and organizations. I have no doubt, that under Catherine's direction, St. Margaret's Community Outreach will continue to grow in its ministry to the "least of these."

Other Outreach funds go to support programs outside of our parish and local community - programs such as Camp Mikell, Holy Comforter, Emmaus House, college chaplaincies and world relief.

Giving is not only monetary. You have given your time and talent as workers at Homework Helper, chaperoning a youth event, cooking dinner for Wednesday night programs, teaching Sunday School or leading EFM, working at the Thrift Shop, setting the altar, welcoming the stranger, setting up for receptions after a funeral or on St Margaret's Day, and putting together a Valentine's luncheon as well as being there for each other in sad and difficult times. You were here; ready to serve, in the midst of grief as we celebrated the life of Fr. Jim Callahan – one who loved you dearly as rector for nearly two decades. You are amazing.

As we stand on the threshold of 2007, we stand on solid ground.

Our staff is phenomenal. As my clergy colleagues in the Diocese remind me often, we are very lucky to have both Laura Leneus and Julie Foreman on staff. (They don't know Dr. Coe or Catherine or they would be on their list as well.)

During her four years on staff, Laura's wisdom, consistency, passion, organization and vision for youth and children's ministries have built a ministry that, as Lin Reed commented, "is one of the best in town." Godly Play, Rite 13 and Journey to Adulthood Programs are powerful teachers about a life of faith lived within community. In addition to organizing and implementing ski trips, pilgrimages, camp events and Christmas pageants, Laura has served on the Diocesan Christian Education Commission – a position appointed by the Bishop of Atlanta.

Julie's expertise and experience in "running the place" are invaluable. With ease, she handles the details of the parish, runs interference for Outreach, takes pictures for the newsletter (which she edits) and can defuse a situation with her quick wit. I appreciate her steadfastness and commitment. As past president of PANDA (Parish Administrators in the Diocese of Atlanta) and delegate to Council, Julie also is respected throughout the diocese.

Dr. Coe – what a gift! His knowledge and love of traditional church music make our liturgies come alive. What I have come to appreciate most about Bob is his deep love and care for all who sing in the choir – and for me, for Kathy, his friends, St. Margaret's, and the staff.

My musings above about Catherine Gordon's impact on Outreach barely scratch the surface of the depth of her invaluable contributions as a staff member.

St. Margaret's has received a treasure in Penny Nash this year. Penny is a 2nd year seminarian at Candler School of Theology and will be with us until she graduates in May of 2008. She has touched our hearts with her preaching, energy and insight. She will make a marvelous parish priest.

We stand on solid ground financially as well. Pledged and non-pledged income in 2006 exceeded our expectations. We have no debt and our investments are under the careful watch of the Investment Committee and Vestry. As some of our larger givers have died or moved on, there has been a paradigm shift in pledging. No longer do we rely on a few large donors for the bulk of our income. Income is coming from a much broader base within the parish. It is a very healthy shift.

Much has happened in the nearly 5 years that I have been your rector. Know that I am proud of you. I feel blessed to be your rector. I thank God for each and every one of you.

Thrift Shop. Through the efforts of Fred Bernhardt, Greg Carey, Tom Foremen and their work crews, an air conditioner and new lights and fans have been installed.

Members of St. Margaret's continue to faithfully attend monthly work days and have managed to keep the Thrift Shop tidy, well stocked and attractively arranged. Many thanks also to Fred Bernhardt and John Muffley who spend extra days sorting, re-stocking and general upkeep. The annual income from this Thrift shop this year was \$7399.46!

The ECW wishes to take this opportunity to say THANK YOU for all (men and women) who serve as hostesses, who take meals to families in time of need, who make the Valentine's Luncheon so special, and who work so faithfully at the Thrift Shop. We are blessed to be an active part of this community of caring.

Miscellaneous items: Disposable aluminum pans, reusable plastic containers, aluminum foil, waxed paper, and plastic wrap.

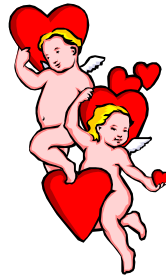


STEP AT A TIME ROAD RACE

Achieving the U.N. Millennium Development Goals

Become 'ONE Episcopalian,' join the effort for global good

First in a 10-part series

To the more than one billion of God's people around the world who live each day in extreme poverty, the most important thing each of us can do today is visit www.episcopalchurch.org/ONE and become "ONE Episcopalian."

Did you know that every three seconds in our world, someone dies simply because he or she is too poor to continue living? Or that every six seconds, someone dies from AIDS, malaria, or tuberculosis? Or that in Asia, Latin America, Africa, and the Caribbean, a child is orphaned every 14 seconds?

These brutal realities — along with issues like conflict and war, inequality between men and women, and lack of basic education for millions of children around the world — comprise the phenomenon known as global poverty. The good news is that the solutions for global poverty are within the world's reach. The Millennium Development Goals (MDGs), a set of eight targets for eradicating global poverty, have been adopted by more than 190 nations, including the United States. The goals are built on the understanding that the resources, strategies, and knowledge to end this crisis exist if only the moral will can be built.

That's where Episcopalians like us come in.

Recognizing that people of faith are key to building the will to achieve the goals, the Episcopal Church's 75th General Convention in June 2006 voted to make the goals the top mission priority for the church over the next three years. In order to do this, the Convention endorsed a new effort called ONE Episcopalian, in which the church has partnered with ONE: The Campaign to Make Poverty History (www.ONE.org).

The ONE Campaign is a movement of more than two million Americans of all beliefs and every walk of life who believe that by standing as one we can call our government to do more to fight poverty and disease in the world. The campaign never asks for your money. It asks for your voice with our government, because that's what's needed to achieve the MDGs.

Let us pray that the cries of the poor, hungry, and neglected all over the world for daily bread may inspire works of compassion and mercy among those to whom much has been given.

The campaign calls for the U.S. government to spend an additional one percent of its budget each year on fighting poverty in the world. (Currently, the U.S. spends far less than one percent.) That additional one percent can prevent 10 million children from becoming AIDS orphans; put 104 million children in grade school; provide safe drinking water to 900 million people around the world; and save 6.5 million children from death before their fifth birthdays.

In short, an additional one percent would build a better, safer world for all people; a world that looks radically more like God's will for it. The only way it will get done, though, is with your voice.

One by one, Episcopalians can help make poverty history. ■
